Margaret River & The Great Southern

Peter Rigby and Di Cullen

Nomad Books, pbk, \$14.95

This pint-sized book might be small in dimension but it is a sizeable celebration of the West Australian Margaret River region. Atmospheric black and white photographs by Trish Ainslie and Roger Garwood celebrate the region's natural beauty, rich produce and local life. Peter Rigby introduces the area and its recent history, while a 1995 interview with the late Di Cullen, of Cullen vineyards, recalls the growth of the Margaret River. A handy travel companion to the area, it is available widely in Western Australia and elsewhere at select bookstores and wineries.

Pacific Journeys

Peter Hendrie

Bookwise, hbk, \$69.95

Melbourne-based photographer Peter Hendrie has compiled a collection of photos from the Pacific Islands that includes scenes from Papua New Guinea, Vanuatu, Tonga, Samoa, Easter Island and New Zealand. The photographic journey began as a single assignment for the now-defunct *Pacific Panorama* magazine. Each section opens with a short introduction covering basic geographical and historical details, but the book's focus is its rich pictorial display of island life. Full-page colour photos, along with smaller detail shots, give a sense of the beauty and magnitude of places such as Kauai in Hawaii, and west Upolu in Samoa.

A Day in the Life of Africa

David Cohen and Lee Liberman

The first in the renowned 'A Day in the Life of' series to fully utilise digital photography, this book contains more than 250 colour and black and white images, taken on 28 February 2002 by photojournalists scattered across Africa. Their mission was to capture a continent in transition, and the photographs are suitably inspiring, presenting an extraordinary tableau – from a delicate pink dawn beside the Sphinx in Cairo, to a surreal moonrise over a Dogon village in Mali. Billed as 'a celebration of life to save life', profits from the book's sales will help fund AIDS education programs in Africa.
